Tennessee College of Applied Technology-Harriman is accepting applications for the position of Diesel Powered Equipment Technology Instructor.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Minimum of a high school diploma or equivalency; Associate Degree preferred.
- ASE Master Technician in Medium/Heavy Duty Repair or be master certified within 12 months of hire date.
- Must have a minimum of 5 years' related work experience in the Diesel Field.
- Must have a strong hands-on technical background in all aspects of diesel technology; prior teaching a plus.
- Must possess the organizational and communications skills necessary to be an effective teacher.
- Must commit to remain current in the field of Diesel Technology.
- Must have excellent communication and interpersonal skills.
- Must possess computer skills and ability to utilize technology to enhance teaching.

General Duties:

- Provide individualized classroom and lab instruction to secondary and adult students.
- Develop curricula to supplement the computer-based instruction with lab activities and exercises that prepare students for employment in the diesel field.
- Monitor, grade, and evaluate individual students' progress.
- Maintain appropriate records and submit timely reports.
- Assist in recruitment and placement of students.
- Maintain good public relations with business and industry and maintain an active advisory committee.

Successful candidate will be required to pass background check/drug screen.
